Ordinance No. 26, 2020

AN ORDINANCE CREATING A NEW LINE ITEM WITHIN THE GENERAL FUND AND APPROPRIATING FROM UNAPPROPRIATED MONEY IN THE GENERAL FUND THE SUM OF \$6,000.00 TO THE NEWLY CREATED LINE ITEM.

Ordinance No. 27, 2020

AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF \$31,547.59 FROM UNAPPROPRIATED MONEY IN THE STORM WATER UTILITY FUND. The State

Auditor recommended that this money be taken in the entire amount as in previous years.

Ordinance No. 28, 2020

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 50.10(C), TITLED WATER RATES/SPECIAL CHARGES, AND SECTION 50.11(F), TITLED WATER CAPACITY AND METER FEE OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF LOGAN, OHIO.

Ordinance No. 29, 2020

AN ORDINANCE ACCEPTING THE BID FROM SHELLY & SANDS, INC. OF ZANESVILLE, OHIO IN THE AMOUNT OF \$181,881.50 PENDING APPROVAL BY THE OHIO PUBLIC WORKS COMMISSION, FOR THE PAVING OF CITY STREETS, AMENDING RESOLUTION NO. 38, 2019 TO INCREASE THE CITY'S COSTS OF THE IMPROVEMENT TO FORTY-FIVE PERCENT (45%) AND PAYING THE CITY'S SHARE OF \$81,881.50 OUT OF THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT FUND AND THE STREET GOVERNMENT FUND. Ordinance No. 30, 2020

AN ORDINANCE TO ELIMINATE TWO (2) PARKING SPACES ON THE WEST SIDE OF MULBERRY STREET, SAID PARKING SPACES MORE SPECIFICALLY IDENTIFIED AS THE FIRST NORTH SPACE AND THE FIRST SOUTH SPACE ON EITHER SIDE OF FEDERAL STREET, IN THE CITY OF LOGAN

FIRST READING:

Ordinance No. 31, 2020

AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING THE TOTAL SUM OF \$5,952.00 FROM UNAPPROPRIATED MONEY IN THE GENERAL FUND. This money originates as seized drug money. It will now be used as a K-9 substance abuse line item.

Ordinance No. 32, 2020

AN ORDINANCE CREATING A NEW LINE ITEM WITHIN THE STORM WATER UTILITY FUND AND APPROPRIATING FROM UNAPPROPRIATED MONEY IN THE STORM WATER UTILITY FUND THE SUM OF \$58,900.00 TO THE NEWLY CREATED LINE ITEM. This money is for preliminary engineering for the rebuilding of Walnut Street.

Ordinance No. 33, 2020

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF LOGAN TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH HOCKING HILLS RV RESORT, LLC, TO PROVIDE WATER SERVICE AND WASTEWATER DISCHARGE TO AN AREA OUTSIDE THE CITY OF

LOGAN. This is considered an opportunity for the city; the RV resort will pay a 25% surcharge and will have 77 spaces with metered sewage providing income for the city.

Resolution No. 14, 2020

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF LOGAN, OHIO, TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES FOR THE WALNUT STREET RECONSTRUCTION DESIGN AND ENGINEERING PROJECT WITH STANTEC CONSULTING SERVICES, INC.

Resolution No. 15, 2020

A RESOLUTION TRANSFERRING THE SUM OF \$10,000.00 FROM THE GENERAL FUND TO THE RECREATION FUND. The state auditors indicated this needs to be a separate legislation for these funds, although it is not new or additional money.

Before adjournment Chapman wanted to acknowledge the hard work of the code enforcement officer, police chief and mayor on the efforts to address the problems in the city with code violations. Chapman asked Officer Posey what is done when someone makes a complaint. He indicated there were currently 250 open cases, 90 being structures that should be condemned, 20 of these should be demolished. He explained different levels of code violation and the time involved in addressing each complaint. He said there were approximately 20 people that were drug addicted homeless that were squatting in structures throughout the city, possibly 50-60.

Police Chief Mellinger said Officer Posey started December 2, 2019 and since that time has done a huge job. Residents are now calling the police to tell Joe not to come to their home for they are now "cleaning up." Due to the Covid-19 situation, the courts have shut down drug programs, leaving those striving to break their addictions with no support, slipping back into their abuse.

ADJOURN: A motion was made by Chapman and seconded by Henniger to adjourn. The motion passed by voice vote – all yea. The meeting adjourned 8:20 p.m.
